How do we finance our energy future?

Investment decisions will determine the pace and direction of reform, and whether we can expand access, build resilience, and grow the economy. I'm joined by Rekha Sinath, Investment Executive at Remgro Ltd and Board Member at the Energy Council, to share insights on the intersection between energy and finance.



Investor confidence is an important transition catalyst. We have seen enough green shoots in our economic reforms to know that progress is possible when policy is clear, consistent, and backed by investment. The energy industry's maturity is reflected in the growing number of trading licences being issued, as the sector shifts towards a competitive wholesale trading environment.

Ambition has driven the intensity for reform, but we have reached a point where momentum is slowing, shaped in part by shifting energy positions and policy uncertainty. The truth is, we cannot afford to retreat on the commitments we have made. Policy is in place. The task ahead is to restore confidence, align implementation, and ensure that capital is directed toward projects that advance the transition.

Remgro and RMB's Energy Exchange of Southern Africa (EXSA) have partnered with Seriti Green on a R5-billion, 155 MW wind project in Mpumalanga. The project is part of Seriti Green's larger 900 MW Ummbila Emoyeni hybrid energy complex, which will be rolled out in phases across 27 000 hectares in the province.


